

## Cookie Policy

### What are cookies?

Cookies are small, simple text files that are placed on your computer's hard drive when you visit a webpage. These cookies can help optimise your visit to the website. For example, your preferences are remembered so that we only show you information which is of interest to you. Another advantage is that you do not have to log in or fill in the same information every time you visit a certain website.

### Why are we informing you about the use of cookies?

On Tuesday 5 June 2012, the amended Telecommunications Act entered into force in the Netherlands. Among other things, this means that certain cookies may only be placed with the explicit consent of the internet user. That is why we are letting you know that our website uses cookies and what the reason for that is.

### Google Analytics

Cookies also enable us to keep track of visitor statistics. We use Google Analytics to gain insight into visitor behaviour on our website. This data gives us an insight into the surfing and visiting behaviour of our visitors and enables us to optimise our website for you where possible. The information that Google collects is anonymised as much as possible. Your IP address will not be provided.

### Accepting or rejecting cookies

You can decide whether to accept or refuse cookies. Most browsers are set up by default to accept cookies, but you can usually change the settings of your browser so that cookies are refused. You will have to adjust this for each browser and for each computer. You can find explanations on how to change the settings in the 'help function' of your browser:
